- A. The opening ceremony had to speak for the country. Britain introduced its parts: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland and celebrated the most prominent parts of their history, traditions and even climate. The famous London fog and rain were not forgotten either. The second part was devoted to the great Industrial Revolution, the era when Britain became the most powerful empire in the world. The third part addressed modern achievements including the National Health Service which is free for everybody in the UK.
- B. Self-deprecating humour is one of the most prominent British traditions, and even the Queen is not above it. The audience was delighted to see the acting debut that Queen Elizabeth had prepared for the opening ceremony. The famous character James Bond, played by actor Daniel Craig, entered Buckingham Palace to speak with the Queen. After a short conversation the Queen and her super agent followed by the Queen's dogs rushed into a helicopter to make a spectacular parachute jump and turn up at the ceremony just in time. The two parachutists who actually made the jump were Gary Connery (the Queen) and Mark Sutton (Bond). In fact, they didn't get to the stadium and landed somewhere near Stratford Station.
- C. The Olympic flag was carried into the stadium and the promise to perform fairly and not to use drugs was made by all athletes. One of the last two Olympic torch bearers, English football superstar David Beckham, turned up on the River Thames on board a speed boat and passed it over to Sir Steve Redgrave who won five gold medals at five consecutive Olympics. Sir Steven Redgrave was the sportsman who carried the Olympic torch into the stadium after it had travelled 20,600 kilometres around the world. At this moving moment, another world-famous Englishman took the stage. It was the former leader of "the Beatles" Sir Paul McCartney who performed a song which the whole world could sing along to "Hey, Jude".
- D. The motto of the London Olympic Games was "Inspire a generation". This means that all the time and money invested into the Games and all the buildings which were constructed will be used to promote sports and a healthy lifestyle, set a positive example and inspire a new generation of great athletes. The organisation committee was true to this idea when it selected people to light the Olympic flame.

Usually the best and most famous sportsmen are chosen to do it, but not this time in London. The Olympic flame was lit by six young athletes who represented the future of Great Britain at the Olympic Games.

- E. A billion people all over the world turned their TV sets on to watch the opening ceremony of the London Olympic Games. The show, which included 10,000 adult volunteers, 900 children, 12 horses, 10 chickens, 9 geese, 3 cows and a flock of sheep, cost about 27,762,000 GBP. The man behind this show was the Oscar-winning director Danny Boyle. Danny Boyle was born into a working-class family in Manchester and now lives in east London. His most famous movies are “Trainspotting” and “Slumdog Millionaire”.
- F. Although Olympic Games always involve building new stadiums and arenas, some of the venues used by London 2012 have existed for a long time. One of them is Hampton Court Palace, a former royal residence located on the banks of the River Thames in south-west London. The palace, which was built in the 16th century, used to be home for many British kings and queens and provided an amazing background for the Road Cycling Time Trial. The place itself has some sporting history too: there is the oldest real tennis court in England in its grounds.
